West Yorkshire Police's new technology will allow them to identify criminals more easily and make arrests more quickly.

Wakefield, West Yorkshire: West Yorkshire Police (WYP) has moved to the forefront of the fight against crime with a revolutionary software program from Niche Technology Inc., which puts the full power of the storehouse of police data at the fingertips of officers.

WYP Superintendent Ray Dance says "Niche RMS will give West Yorkshire officers instant access to all the information the force has on file, from thousands of mugshots and offender entries to detailed information on incidents and digital geographic mapping."

The WYP force, Britain's fourth largest with 5,700 officers, began implementing the system on April 3, and plans a phased geographical rollout across its jurisdiction. WYP joins over 80,000 Niche system users in police forces throughout the UK, Canada, Australia and the US.
